**Introductory Session**

An introduction to sparqs, its history and current work. Additionally the session will look at the Student Engagement Framework for Scotland, its development and practical application for delegates in their own work. This sector-endorsed national framework offers an excellent overview of the practical opportunities for increased student engagement in quality. Other sparqs activities covered will include Student Partnership Agreements, engagement work with apprentices, work with articulating students who move from college to university and cultural development with the sector.

**Developing Student Expertise**

This session will introduce delegates to the range of training sparqs offers students, concentrating in particular on the core Course Rep Training module. This module is a 2-hour training session which is delivered across Scotland by a team of student trainers recruited and trained by sparqs. Last year we trained over 4000 students to act as course reps, the foundation of any representative system in education. The training is widely acknowledged to have raised the level of expertise of student representatives ensuring they are able to engage more effectively in learning and teaching enhancement activities.

We will also investigate ways in which delegates could adapt this training and method of delivery to suit their own circumstances and resources.
