





The SESN buddy scheme is back!

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



Shaping the common approach - management of co-creation and integration of workstreams



Using data and evidence to understand, evaluate and improve student outcomes



Strengthening institutional monitoring, self-evaluation and reporting on quality



Evaluating and enhancing the student learning experience and student partnership



Tertiary sector enhancement activity

SFC has set up a series of 5 workstreams to help shape different parts of the tertiary approach.

Workstream 3: institutional monitoring & self-evaluation



- This workstream will deliver a template Self-Evaluation and Action Plan (SEAP) for the college and university sectors.
- The draft templates and accompanying guidance will be tabled at the next Tertiary
 Quality Steering Group (TQSG) meeting for scrutiny and feedback, prior to being
 piloted in a small number of institutions in Autumn 2023.
- The workstream leads will work together with SFC and pilot institutions to support the initial completion of the draft SEAP and gather feedback to inform and refine the final version.
- The final template will be made available to institutions in Spring 2024. All
 institutions will be required to use the new template to submit a self-evaluation and
 action plan by the 30^{th of} November 2024, reflecting on the 2023-24 academic year.

Workstream 2: using data and evidence



- Currently developing a key question set that can be used to assess, manage, enhance, and report on the quality of teaching and the student experience.
- Broadly these relate to <u>access; retention; completion; success;</u> <u>progression; student feedback; student outcomes; learning</u> <u>gain; and success.</u>
- Once this initial work is completed, further consideration will be given to how the key data set can be used to support institutions in completing the Self Evaluation and Action Plan.

Workstream 4: student learning experience & student partnership



- The Student Learning Experience (SLE) model and accompanying questions have been finalised and will be published at sparqs' birthday party on 5th October.
- Over the next year, we will develop supporting guidance to facilitate institutions and SAs to use the model in practice.
- **Descriptors of student partnership in quality processes** are being created for the end of September. These will be used by institutions piloting the SEAP.
